Rochester's 1950-51 wrestling team, coached by Clyde Ridenour, won five of eight conference meets. They avenged an early season defeat by Austin and lost one match by only two points. The loss of Captain John Randall because of a leg injury hurt the locals no little.

The Rockets dropped Winona twice and Austin, Owatonna and Northfield once each. They lost to Austin, Faribault and Albert Lea for their three defeats. During the season Bruce Williams, Loren Kroenig and LeRoy Rud remained undefeated.

In the regional tournament the Red and Black placed third as only two points separated the first three squads. In the state meet, Williams, Kroenig and Alton Benike copped seconds in their respective weight classes to give the Rockets fifth place.

Lettermen Rud, Dunn, Myers, Walton Benike and captain-elect Kroenig will form the nucleus of the 1952 team.
