

Tim Eggert (9) slams his opponent to the mat while tying up his arms. Eggert used this technique to keep his opponent's face pressed against the mat.




What do you think of your opponent while wrestling him?

▼ The referee raises Chris Muller's (12) arm to declare him winner of the match.










